1. What is the reason for going to RFP for these services? (Contract expiration, seeking new vendor, market check, procurement protocol, etc.)

Going out to bid due to:

- The combination of screenings and services In the past flu shots and biometrics were held at different times
- Explore the options available in the market
- 2. What reporting is required for biometrics? Is there a specific frequency?
 - Participant counts daily by screening site
 - Final report, in summary, noting all test results and risk factors based on these results
 - Final listing of all participants by organization
- 3. Will we be sending identified screening data to a 3rd party?
 - Yes, a data file will likely need to be sent for the blood test results to the Colorado Regional Health Information Organization.
- 4. Do employees receive an incentive for participating in biometric screenings? If so, is this participation based or outcomes based?
 - No employee incentive
- 5. What screening options were offered onsite last year?
 - Blood pressure
 - BMI
 - Triglyceride, cholesterol, glucose
 - Voluntary blood testing provided at employee cost
 - Vitamin D
 - Full Chem test
 - CBC
- 6. What challenges did you face with your incumbent screening vendor? No significant challenges.
 - a. Did they provide fingerstick and venipuncture?
 - Venipuncture only
 - b. Did your incumbent vendor use their own online platform?
 - Vendor appointment online platform used
 - Online site check-in system used which housed online consents for the screenings.
- 7. Did they use tablet technology onsite to conduct the screenings?
 - No, paper forms were used by biometric vendor
 - Online registration system used onsite at each event for check-in
